Tires are recycled into playground fill and crumb rubber. The events are conducted in partnership with the Cities of Palmdale and Lancaster, and provide an important tool to keep the Antelope Valley clean.

If County residents are unable to attend the Free Dump Day or Waste Tire Collection Event, the following events are also available throughout the year at Waste Management of Lancaster, located at 600 East Avenue F, in Lancaster:

- <u>Free Bulky Item Drop-off:</u> County residents can drop off one bulky item per year, such as a sofa, table, mattress, etc., free of charge.
- Free Waste Tire Drop-off: County residents can drop-off up to four waste tires per year, free of charge.
- The Antelope Valley Environmental Collection Center: The center is open on

the 1st and 3rd Saturday of each month from 9 am to 3 pm. The center is located at the Waste Management of Palmdale, 1200 West City Ranch Road in Palmdale. This Center provides a safe, efficient and convenient method for County residents to drop off their Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Electronic Waste (E-waste).
