Illegal Dumping Arrest

A male suspect, by the Dean Clay name of Dance, was arrested in Quartz Hill after a tip was received through the Board of Supervisor's office. The tipster provided a photograph of the suspect and his accomplice dumping a load of broken asphalt in the desert in the

area of Avenue K-8 and 52nd Street West.



Information from the photo led to the identification of the suspect, and his arrest. He is charged with a misdemeanor violation of the California Health and Safety Code Section 117555.

occurred in August of 2012. The suspect will appear at the Antelope Valley Court on February 6, 2013.
