County's Recommendations for County & Jurisdiction Roles

Jurisdictions' Roles:

- *Estimate organic waste disposal.
- *Identify existing "verifiably available" capacity.
- *Estimate the amount of new or expanded capacity that will be needed.
- *Conduct community outreach for new or expanded facilities.
- *Consult with community composters.
- *If required, submit an Implementation Schedule to CalRecycle.



County's Recommendations for County & Jurisdiction Roles (Cont.)

County's Roles:

- *Consult with the LEA and Task Force on the status of new or expanded facilities.
- *Consult with haulers and facility owners on existing and potential new or expanded capacity.
- *Report disposal and capacity tonnages to CalRecycle on August 1, 2022.
- Notify each jurisdiction that lacks capacity that they are required to submit and Implementation Schedule to CalRecycle.




Technical and Outreach Assistance Available to Cities


- Public Works is developing a website to collect data from cities and provide the following support:


Edible Food Recovery Capacity Assessment

Food Recovery Organizations/Services:

- 960 identified and contacted (Food Oasis database)
- 267 completed capacity assessment surveys

Next Step:

- Develop a centralized database system to store all info of known food recovery organizations/services.
- Integrated <u>Map</u> with all food recovery organizations who can receive food from businesses.
