

**Pacoima Spreading Grounds Basin Enhancement Project**  
**Air Quality Monitoring Program**  
**Summary Report for February 2022**

1. Background

- During the month of February 2022, real-time monitoring of air pollutants through four monitoring locations (Figure 1) for the Pacoima Spreading Grounds Basin Enhancement Project (Project) was conducted for the staging activities and active hauling.
- Results indicated average ambient PM<sub>10</sub> concentration of 8 - 9 µg/m<sup>3</sup> for all four (4) stations.
  - All stations ran continuously with the exception of #1689 and #1691, which were taken offline for the first weekend of February only (2/5 and 2/6/2022)
- Comparison of upwind and downwind stations at the Pacoima project site with nearest South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) monitoring station (Reseda) PM<sub>2.5</sub> showed similar trends in the data (Figure 2).

2. Field Activity Summary

- The following field activities were continued/initiated:
  - Hauling operation of Basin 6
  - Recycling of concrete via concrete munching
  - Structural work of Structure 1 and 6

3. Air Monitoring Summary

- During staging and hauling activities, real-time monitoring of air pollutants for the Project was conducted and included:
  - Continuous 24 hours per day PM<sub>10</sub> and meteorological parameters monitoring at all four stations for entire month.
  - Monitoring of ozone and NO<sub>2</sub> at two stations (one upwind and one downwind) continuously. No monitoring during holidays, rain events, and on the weekends.

4. Compliance Summary

- Air monitoring data for PM<sub>10</sub> concentrations were in compliance with SCAQMD Rule 403 for the month of February 2022.
